#### **ARDOT - STANDARD BID CONDITIONS**

- 1. **GENERAL:** Any special terms and conditions included in the invitation for bid override these standard terms and conditions. The standard terms and conditions and any special terms and conditions become part of any contract entered into if any or all parts of the bid are accepted by the Arkansas Department of Transportation (ARDOT).
- 2. **ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION:** ARDOT reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to accept bids in whole or in part (unless otherwise indicated by bidder), to waive any informalities in bids received, to accept bids on materials or equipment with variations from specifications where efficiency of operation will not be impaired, and to award bids to best serve the interest of the State.
- 3. **PRICES:** Unless otherwise stated in the Bid Invitation, the following will apply: (1) unit prices shall be bid, (2) prices should be stated in units of quantity specified (feet, each, lbs., etc.), (3) prices must be F.O.B. destination specified in bid, (4) prices must be firm and not subject to escalation, (5) bid must be firm for acceptance for 30 days from bid opening date. In case of errors in extension, unit prices shall govern. Discounts from bid price will not be considered in making awards.
- BID BONDS AND PERFORMANCE BONDS: If required, a Bid Bond in the form of a cashier's check, certified check, or surety bond issued by a surety company, in an amount stated in the Bid Invitation, must accompany bid. Personal and company checks are not acceptable as Bid Bonds. Failure to submit a Bid Bond as required will cause a bid to be rejected. The Bid Bond will be forfeited as liquidated damages if the successful bidder fails to provide a required Performance Bond within the period stipulated by ARDOT or fails to honor their bid. When a bidder claims and can show clear and convincing evidence that a material mistake was made in the bid and was not the bid intended, the bidder may be permitted to withdraw their bid prior to award without forfeiture of bid bond. Cashier's checks and certified checks submitted as Bid Bonds will be returned to unsuccessful bidders; surety bonds will be retained. The successful bidder will be required to furnish a Performance Bond in an amount stated in the Bid Invitation and in the form of a cashier's check, certified check, or surety bond issued by a surety company, unless otherwise stated in the Bid Invitation, as a guarantee of delivery of goods/services in accordance with the specifications and within the time established in the bid. Personal and company checks are not acceptable as Performance Bonds. In some cases, a cashier's check or certified check submitted as a Bid Bond will be held as the Performance Bond of the successful bidder. Cashier's checks or certified checks submitted as Performance Bonds will be refunded shortly after payment has been made to the successful bidder for completion of all terms of the bid; surety bonds will be retained. Surety bonds must be issued by a surety company that is authorized to do business in the State of Arkansas and that is listed on the current United States Department of the Treasury Listing of Approved Sureties. Surety bonds must be executed by a resident or non-resident agent who is licensed by the Arkansas State Insurance Commissioner to represent the surety company executing the bond, and the resident or non-resident agent shall file with the bond the power of attorney of the agent to act on behalf of the bonding company. Certain bids involving labor will require Performance Bonds in the form of surety bonds only (no checks of any kind allowed). These bonds shall not only serve to guarantee the completion of the work, but also to guarantee the excellence of both workmanship and material until the work is finally accepted and the provisions of the Plans, Specifications, and Special Provisions fulfilled. In such cases, the company issuing the surety bond must comply with all stipulations herein and must be named in the U. S. Treasury listing of companies holding Certificates of Authority as acceptable sureties on Federal Bonds and as acceptable reinsuring companies. Any excess between the face amount of the bond and the underwriting limitation of the bonding company shall be protected by reinsurance provided by an acceptable reinsuring company. Annual Bid and Performance Bonds on file with E & P Division must have sufficient unencumbered funds to meet current bonding requirements, or the bid will be rejected, unless the balance is submitted as set forth above, prior to bid opening.
- 5. TAXES: The ARDOT is not exempt from Arkansas State Sales and Use Taxes, or local option city/county sales taxes, when applicable, and bidders are responsible to the State Revenue Department for such taxes. These taxes should not be included in bid prices, but where required by law, will be paid by the ARDOT as an addition thereto, and should be added to the billing to the ARDOT. The ARDOT is exempt from Federal Excise Taxes on all commodities except motor fuels; and excise taxes should not be included in bid prices except for motor fuels. Where applicable, tax exemption certificates will be furnished by the ARDOT.
- 6. "ALL OR NONE" BIDS: Bidders who wish to bid "All or None" on two or more items shall so stipulate on the face of bid sheet; otherwise, bid may be awarded on an individual item basis.
- 7. **SPECIFICATIONS:** Complete specifications should be attached for any substitution or alternate offered, or where amplification is necessary. Bidder's name must be placed on all attachments to the bid.
- 8. **EXCEPTIONS TO SPECIFICATIONS:** Any exceptions to the bid specifications must be stated in the bid. Any exceptions to manufacturer's published literature must be stated in the bid, or it will be assumed that bidder is bidding exactly as stated in the literature.
- BRAND NAME REFERENCES: All brand name references in bid specifications refer to that commodity or its equivalent, unless otherwise stated in Bid Invitation. Bidder should state brand or trade name of item being bid, if such name exists.
- 10. **FREIGHT:** All freight charges should be included in bid price. Any change in common carrier rates authorized by the Interstate Commerce Commission will be adjusted if such change occurs after the bid opening date. Receipted common carrier bills that reflect ICC authorized rate changes must be furnished.

- 11. **SAMPLES, LITERATURE, DEMONSTRATIONS:** Samples and technical literature must be provided free of any charge within 14 days of ARDOT request, and free demonstrations within 30 days, unless ARDOT extends time. Failure to provide as requested within this period may cause bid to be rejected. Samples, literature and demonstrations must be substantially the same as the item(s) being bid, unless otherwise agreed to by ARDOT. Samples that are not destroyed will be returned upon request at bidders expense. Samples from successful bidders may be retained for comparison with items actually furnished.
- 12. **GUARANTY:** Unless otherwise indicated in Bid Invitation, it is understood and agreed that any item offered or shipped on this bid shall be newly manufactured, latest model and design, and in first class condition; and that all containers shall be new, suitable for storage or shipment and in compliance with all applicable laws relating to construction, packaging, labeling and registration.
- 13. **BACKORDERS OR DELAY IN DELIVERY:** Backorders or failure to deliver within the time required may constitute default. Vendor must give written notice to the ARDOT, as soon as possible, of the reason for any delay and the expected delivery date. The ARDOT has the right to extend delivery if reasons appear valid. If reason or delivery date is not acceptable, vendor is in default.
- 14. **DEFAULT:** All commodities furnished will be subject to inspection and acceptance by ARDOT after delivery. Default in promised delivery or failure to meet specifications authorizes the ARDOT to cancel award or any portion of same, to reasonably purchase commodities or services elsewhere and to charge full increase, if any, in cost and handling to defaulting vendor. Applicable bonds may be forfeited.
- 15. **ETHICS:** "It shall be a breach of ethical standards for a person to be retained, or to retain a person, to solicit or secure a State contract upon an agreement of understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies maintained by the contractor for the purpose of securing business." (Arkansas Code, Annotated, Section 19-11-708).
- 16. **NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION:** The Arkansas State Highway Commission, through ARDOT, complies with all civil rights provisions of federal statutes and related authorities that prohibit discrimination in programs and activities receiving federal financial assistance. Therefore, ARDOT does not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, color, age, national origin, religion (not applicable as a protected group under the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration Title VI Program), disability, Limited English Proficiency (LEP), or low-income status in the admission, access to and treatment in the ARDOT's programs and activities, as well as the ARDOT's hiring or employment practices. #### PURPOSE OF SPECIFICATIONS

This item shall be a vehicle suitable for public transportation. The intent for these specifications is to set-forth the minimum performance for a commercial conversion van. The vehicle shall be a conversion of a standard production van, which will be used to transport elderly and ambulatory disabled persons living in urban and rural areas. Vehicle shall be available as a fixed seat passenger vehicle. This vehicle shall accommodate various seating combinations and will be required to operate on all types of neighborhood streets and rural roads with frequent starts and stops.

All manufacturing modifications, equipment, devices, materials, warranties, miscellaneous items, etc. which the manufacturer customarily and routinely applies to the vehicle shall be included. No advantage shall be taken by the manufacturer in the omission of any part or detail, which goes to make the vehicle complete and ready for service, even though such parts or detail are not mentioned in these specifications. Vehicle and modifications must comply with all Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards. All equipment provided must meet or exceed State and Federal requirements applicable to the equipment. All parts not specifically mentioned which are necessary in order to provide a complete vehicle, shall, at a minimum, conform in strength, quality of material and workmanship to what is provided by the automotive industry generally.

<u>Dealer shall have as part of the documentation with receipt of each vehicle, a form with a detailed listing of the warranties on the vehicle, conversion and ordered options.</u>

All equipment and parts shall be new and conform in strength; quality of material and workmanship to those approved by and generally utilized by the automotive industry and meets all applicable standards.

Second Stage Manufacturer shall be certified as an acceptable body modifier for the OEM chassis proposed for modification.

#### **CLASSIFICATION OF VEHICLE CHASSIS**

The vehicle used for this conversion shall be a new, unused, **current production model <u>unibody rear wheel</u> drive passenger wagon**, **max front GVWR**, incorporating the latest engineering change with a minimum GVWR of 9,000 #, sufficient to accommodate all modifications and maximum passenger loading. The vehicle shall provide maximum passenger appeal in appearance, comfort, safety and economy of operation.

#### NOTICE OF NONDISCRIMINATION

#### A. Principal Specifications:

- 1. <u>Air conditioning</u>: Shall have the largest OEM available system available for the front and rear compartment.
- 2. Alternator: OEM Heavy duty, capable of no less than 220 amps at maximum output.
- 3. **<u>Automatic Speed Control</u>**: Shall have factory cruise control installed.
- 4. Backup Camera: Shall have an OEM backup camera system.
- 5. Battery: Shall have a dual battery system with a minimum of 1220 cold cranking amps at 0° F.
- 6. **Brakes**: Power front and rear disc with four-wheel anti-lock.
- 7. Chassis: Shall have a minimum wheelbase of 147" and a minimum overall length of 236".
- 8. <u>Cooling System</u>: Heavy duty, including heavy duty, extra capacity radiator, and factory installed coolant recovery system.

- 24. <u>Metal and Metal Fasteners</u>: All metal and metal fasteners, including any required nuts and washers, used in the manufacturing process shall be rust and corrosive resistant. Metal and metal coating processes to ensure rust and corrosive resistant properties shall be subject to testing and approval. Metal and metal screws exposed to the outside environment shall be stainless steel or approved equal to the extent possible.

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- 25. <u>Mirrors</u>: Factory installed power dual outside breakaway 6" X 9" mirrors. Shall have an OEM day night type rear view mirror and a maximum 4" X 7" convex rear view mirror center mounted to provide driver full view of the van's interior.
- 26. <u>Paint</u>: Van shall be painted the manufacturer's standard solid white and have a 2" high intensity <u>white 3M Diamond Grade 983 Series reflective tape</u> stripe down both sides of vehicle just below side windows and along the rear of vehicle just under rear window(s).
- 27. Radio: Shall provide the OEM AM/FM stereo with Bluetooth interface.
- 28. **Rear Axle**: Manufacturer to select axle ratio, which will provide the best overall performance, and of the heaviest duty available.
- 29. Running Board: Shall have the OEM running board, driver and passenger side extended length.
- 30. **Rust proofing**: Shall be fully undercoated with a premium automotive flame retardant undercoating applied including wheel wells.
- 31. **Seats**: Shall retain the OEM driver's and front passenger's seat unless otherwise stipulated.
- 32. Seats, Passenger: All Vehicles, no matter what seating configuration, shall have at a minimum, three seat positions that accommodate infant seats with three-point child restraint system (CRS). Seating shall be Freedman GO Seat ES or approved equal. Seats must meet or exceed all applicable Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards including FMVSS 207 and 210. Seating system must be tested in vehicle at an A2LA accredited lab to insure compliance to aforementioned standards. Double passenger seats must be minimum 35" wide, the cushion depth shall be 16" minimum and the cushion height above the floor shall be 17.5" minimum, 19.5" maximum. Back cushion height shall be "mid hi" and must be minimum 24" from the top of the seat cushion. Seat frame must be convertible to accept Child Restraint System (CRS-225) with LATCH hooks (Rigid & Recliner variations only). Child Restraint System (CRS-225) LATCH hooks must also be available as an option on foldaway seats. All ambulatory seats must be mechanically fastened to the base frame utilizing a U-bolt based system that allows for easy removal/installation (not applicable to flip or foldaway seats). All seats shall be FMVSS 225 compliant and shall secure either a passenger or a child safety seat. Minimum hip to knee room on transverse mounted seats shall be 26" unless otherwise approved. Aisle width may vary according to seating configuration with a minimum of 10". Fold-Away Seats: Seating shall meet the same requirements as ambulatory forward facing seats. The seat must be cantilevered and must not require an aisle leg or tether for support. The foldaway seat must require no more than 3 operations to either store or deploy. In the stored position, the foldaway seat must be less than 13" wide. All foldaway seats must match the visual and functional design of the other seats in the van.
- 33. <u>Seat Belts</u>: Seat frame must have a 3 point shoulder belt. All seats belts shall meet or exceed FMVSS 209 and 210. A premium web cutter shall be supplied with each vehicle and shall be

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- mounted in a highly visible location in the driver's area and have a label stating "Seat Belt and Wheel Chair Securement Belt Cutter".
- 34. Seating Capacity: Item 1 shall have a seating capacity of twelve (12) passengers plus the driver (four double fixed seats and three single fixed seats plus factory driver and front passenger seats); Item 2 shall have a seating capacity of seven (7) plus driver three double foldaway flip seats directly behind the driver's factory seat with factory driver and front passenger seats) with two wheelchair positions. Seating diagrams depicting the manufacturer's offerings in both non-ADA equipped and ADA equipped units to meet the required specifications shall be submitted with each bid and shall include a weight analysis.
- 35. Stanchion Poles: Shall have two Stanchion Poles, one mounted at the forward edge of the passenger entry area from the floor to the "B" pillar and one mounted at the rear edge of the passenger entry area from the floor to the "C" pillar. The Stanchion Poles shall be made of stainless steel with a cross section diameter of a minimum of 1-1/4 inches.
- 36. <u>Suspension</u>: Shall be the highest GVWR offered by the manufacturer with factory roll stability control and a stabilizer bar shall be provided in the front. Rear suspension must accommodate any increased load capacity of an optional lift.
- 37. <u>Tires</u>: Shall be the OEM's premium tubeless all-season radials rated for the size and GVWR to include a spare tire and wheel of the same OEM type.

Shall be FMVSS 403 and 404 compliant. Lift doors shall have a securement device acceptable to the Department that prevents doors from closing during loading and unloading of passengers. Door entrance shall be a minimum of 56". If required, the OEM doorstops shall be extended to eliminate the lift striking the doors. ADA decals shall be affixed to the lift, to the outside side and outside rear door of the vehicle.
- 40. Wheelchair Restraint System: Item 2 shall have two (2) belt restraint systems of a premium model complete wheelchair and occupant securement systems designed for endurance and ease of use. All wheelchair tie downs shall have self-tensioning retractors and the lap/shoulder belts shall have retractors. Securement systems shall be Q-Straint, Sure-Lock or approved equal. Securement system shall be a <u>full length L-track kit</u> or approved equal. L-tracks shall be placed in a design that meets or exceeds ADA wheelchair securement requirements and specifications. <u>Shoulder belts shall be mounted and securely fastened to the driver's side wall and meet ADA requirements.</u> A storage pouch for each set of restraints, designed to accommodate restraint belts, shall be constructed from commercial type heavy duty reinforced vinyl/cloth material affixed to the inside of the vehicle in a location easily accessible and does not interfere with passenger comfort or seating placement. Shall be compliant with all ADA requirements and specifications.
- 41. Windshield wipers: Intermittent.
- 42. <u>Windows</u>: Shall be OEM standard side and rear windows and have power front driver and passenger windows. All side and rear glass shall be tinted smoke gray, darkest available from OEM, or no less than 30% light transmitting.

- A. <u>Child Safety Alert System</u>: Shall offer a child safety alert system <u>that activates automatically</u> which requires the driver to perform an inspection of the passenger compartment before leaving the vehicle, shall be a <u>Bus Scan 300</u> or an approved equal.

#### TERMS, CONDITIONS, AND PROVISIONS

All Bidders will adhere to the following terms, conditions, and provisions:

**Legal Requirements:** Bidders must possess, and be in compliance with, all local, state, and federal licensing and other legal requirements for the distribution and/or sales of the motor vehicles and other products proposed; and, shall submit a <u>copy of the **Arkansas Dealers License**, Buy America Documentation, and Bus Manufacturer's Certification or other documentation as may be required.</u>

Signatures: All bidders must complete the Bid Quotation Form by providing all required. Each page of the Appendix A and B must be initialed and returned with the bid quotation. The Required Federal Certifications and Contractual Provisions (Appendix B) must be executed by completing and signing the last page in ink and be attested by a Notary Public.

**Specification Detail:** All bidders must provide the manufacturer's specifications in sufficient detail to determine compliance with all specifications set-forth in the advertisement for bids for chassis, body and accessories. The bidder must provide floor plan drawings of the proposed vehicle-seating configuration and weight analysis.

Warranty and Service Center: All bidders must have, and identify, a warranty and service location in Arkansas and staffed with factory trained personnel for all vehicles and major component equipment proposed. Further, the bidder must be able to perform, or have performed warranty and service on all items not covered by original equipment manufacturer's warranty. Any such facility must have an adequate supply of parts to cover vehicle body components and related equipment (i.e., windows, seats, electrical system and lights, air conditioning, wheelchair lifts and tiedown equipment).

**Operator's Manual:** The successful bidder shall furnish copy of Operator's Manual published by vehicle manufacturer with each vehicle delivered.

Advertisements: No dealer advertisement shall be affixed to the vehicle.

**Serviced:** Each vehicle shall be completely serviced, cleaned and thoroughly inspected (in accordance with manufacturer's required or recommended pre-delivery service) just prior to delivery to the Department.

**Vehicle OEM Warranty** - The successful bidder shall not allow any contractors/manufacturers to perform any manufacturing process, component installation, or take any other action which will violate or otherwise cause the vehicle OEM to withdraw their full and complete warranty.

**Warranties:** The successful bidder shall furnish all warranty data for each vehicle delivered, as well as any warranty data for non-OEM components installed. If the revisions and amendments require changes in quantities or prices bid, or both, the date set for opening bids may be postponed by such number of days as, in the opinion of the Department, shall enable bidders to revise their bids. In any case, bid opening shall be at least 5 working days after the last addendum, and the addendum shall include an announcement of the new date, if applicable, for opening bids.

**Public Bid Opening:** Bids shall be publicly opened and read aloud at the time and place indicated in the Department's Bid Invitation. Their content, including documents marked proprietary, shall be made public for the information of bidders and other interested parties, who may be present, either in person or by representatives.

**Award of Contract:** Any award will be made by written notice to the successful Bidder within thirty (30) days after the opening of the bids. Bids must therefore remain valid for thirty (30) days from date of the bid opening.

**Responsiveness:** The Department shall determine responsiveness by the Bidder's adherence to the specifications as defined herein or by addenda; completeness of bid, and satisfactory submittal of fully executed bid forms and certifications, and bid and performance bonds. Responsiveness to this bid shall also be determined by the Bidder's substantiation of qualifications, including consideration of past performance.

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**Bid Rejection**: The Department reserves the right to waive any and all minor bid informalities or irregularities received, or to reject, for good and compelling reasons, any and all bids submitted. Conditional bids, or those which take exceptions to the specifications, will be considered nonresponsive and will be rejected.

**Single Bid Response:** If only one bid is received in response to the invitation for bids, a detailed cost proposal may be requested of the single bidder. A cost/price analysis and evaluation and/or audit may be performed of the cost proposal in order to determine if the price is fair and reasonable.

**Addenda:** Addenda issued by the Department prior to the bid opening shall be binding as if written into the original IFB.

Bid Evaluation Criteria: A selection committee will review and evaluate all bids submitted.

(9) Except for transactions authorized under Paragraph 5 of these instruction, if a participant in a covered transaction knowingly enters into a lower tier covered transaction with a person who is suspended, debarred, ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction, in addition to all remedies available to the Federal Government, the Department may pursue available remedies including suspension and/or debarment.
