




Temporary 0.5% Sales Tax HJR 1001

- November 6, 2012 election ballot
- Temporary Increase
- Does not apply to groceries, medicine, fuel
- \$230m annually (\$160m/\$35m/\$35m)
- State Aid Street Fund for City Streets




Temporary 0.5% Sales Tax

- Bond debt retired over 10 years
- \$1.3 Billion in general obligation bonds
- Tax expires when the bonds are retired
- Four-lane highways
- \$1.8 Billion program supports 40,000 jobs






