





Per-Gallon Tax is the Primary Funding Source for Highways




Fuel Consumption is Declining







- State Aid Street Fund for City Streets




Issue Number 1

- \$1.8 Billion program supports 40,000 jobs




Statewide Transportation Improvement Plan

2013-2016






