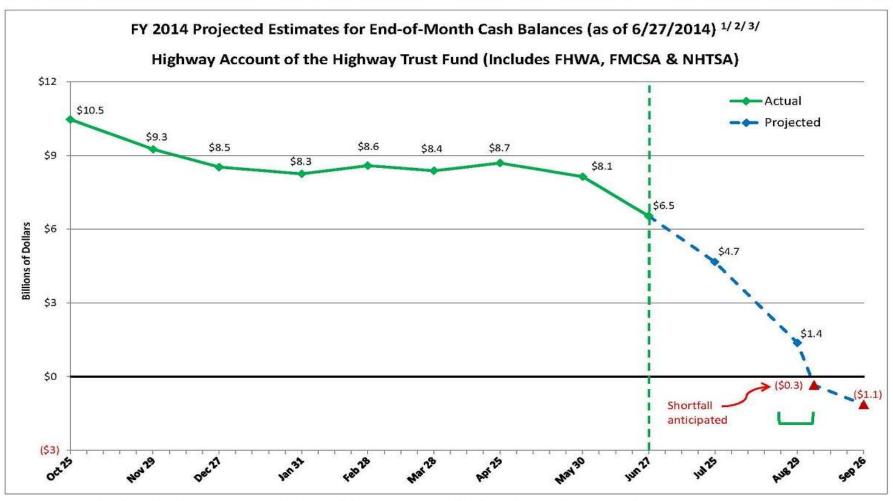

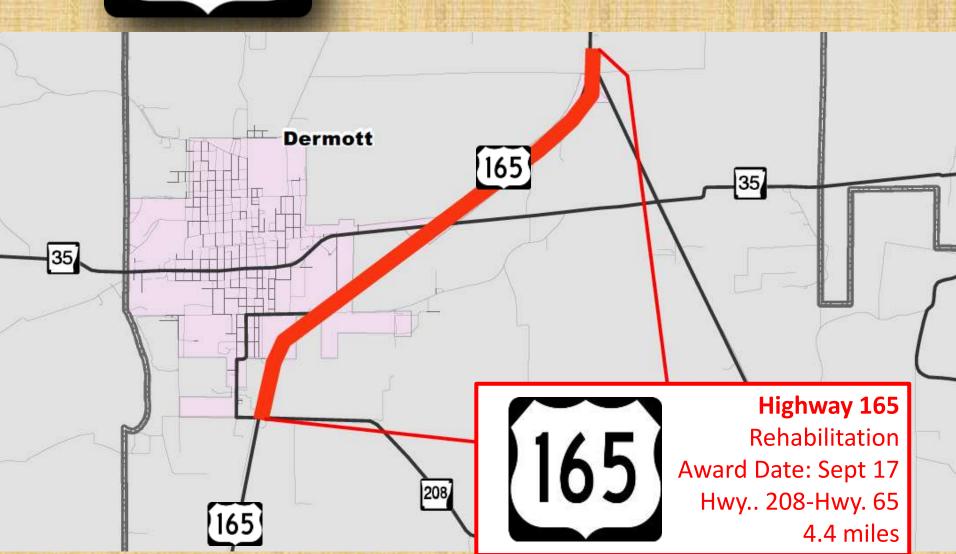

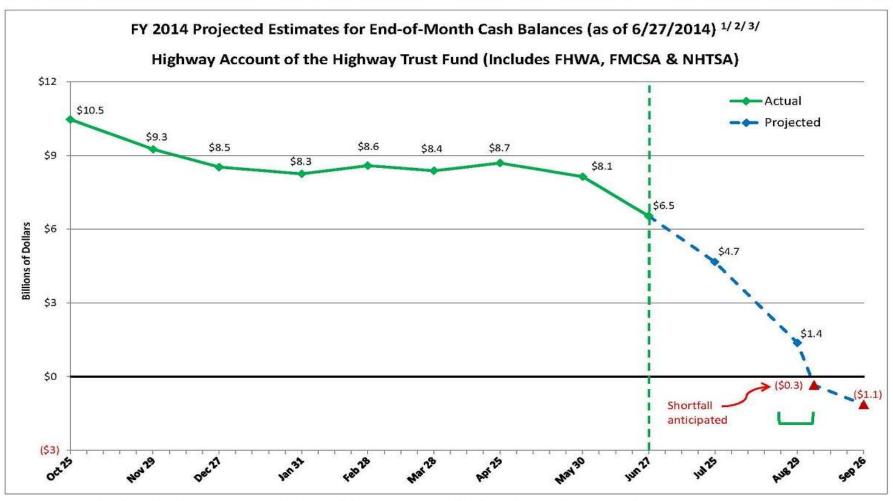

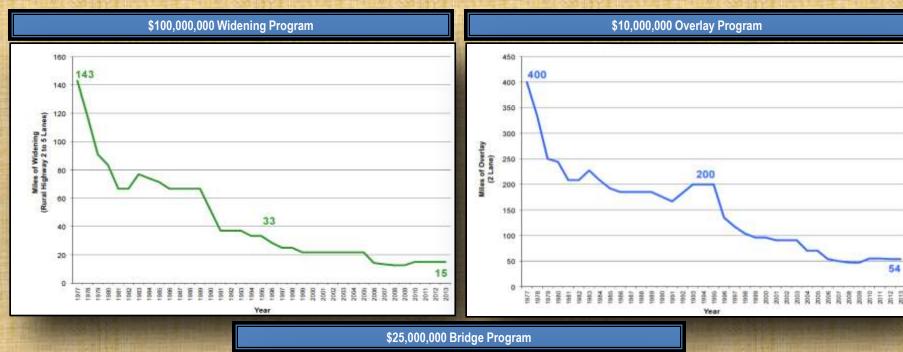

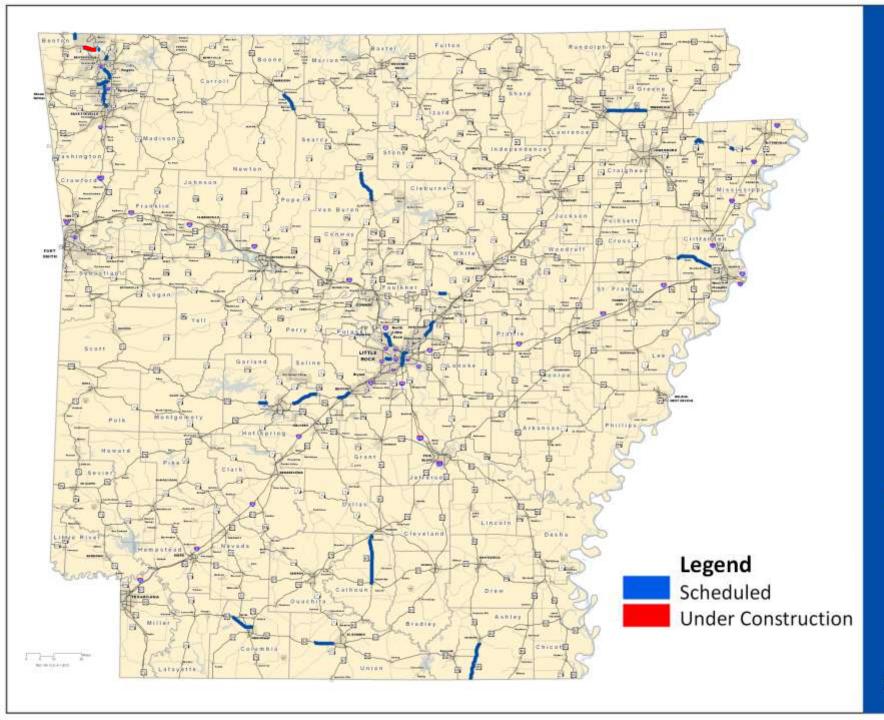

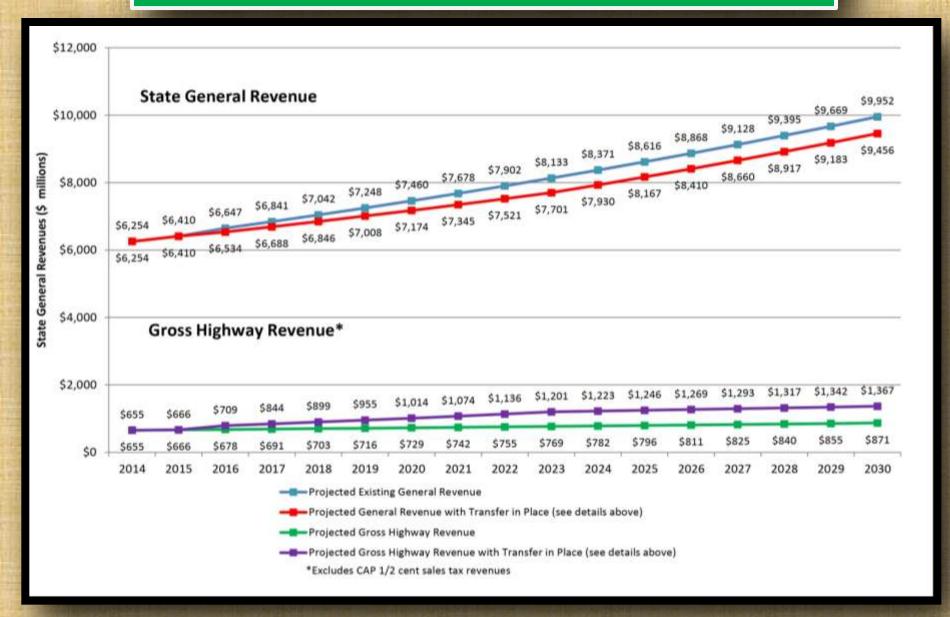

State General Revenues vs. AHTD Net Highway Revenues

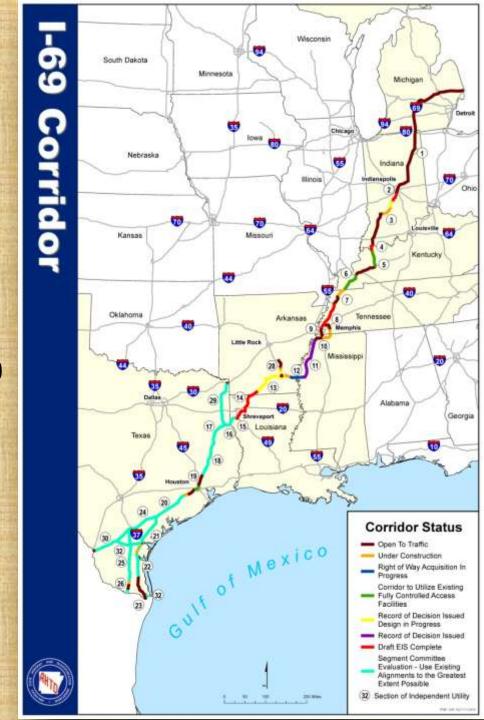


Effect of Proposed Revenue Transfers on State General & Gross Highway Revenues

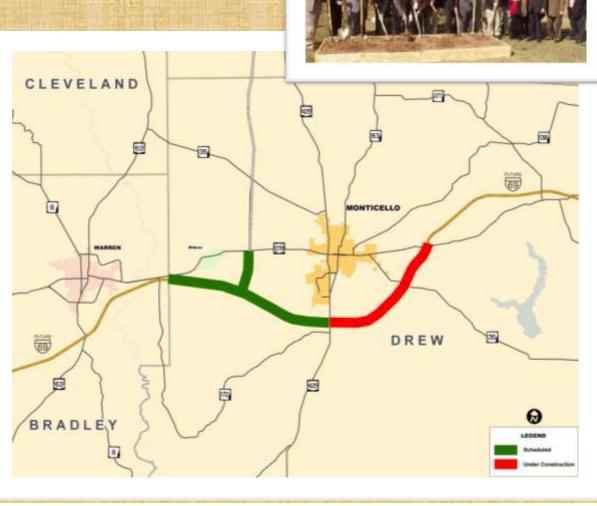
