





## Federal-aid Highway Program

#### **AUTHORIZATION ACT**

- Multi-Year Legislation
- Authority to Continue:
  - Federal Highway Administration Operations
  - Certain Federal Programs
  - Collecting Highway-User Tax
- Establishes:
  - New Federal Program Categories
  - Program Category Funding Levels
  - Formulas for Distribution to States

#### **EXAMPLES**

Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century (1998) (TEA-21)

Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (2005) (SAFETEA-LU)

Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (2012) (MAP-21)

## Federal-aid Highway Program

#### **APPROPRIATION ACT**

- Enacted Each Fiscal Year
- Gives Authority to FHWA to:
  - Appropriate Funds to States Based on Authorization Act Levels
  - Set the Obligation Authority
  - Provide Cash Reimbursements to the States
- Gives Authority to AHTD to Obligate Federal-aid Funds on Projects

"Obligation means a binding agreement that will result in outlays, immediately or in the future."


FHWA Commits to Reimburse State for Federal Share of Eligible Expenses (normally 80%)

## Reimbursable Program

"Federal Funds are Not Upfront Cash"

- ✓ FHWA Approves Federal Funding for a Project
  - ✓ Project Let to Contract
    - ✓ Contractor Submits Progress Estimate
      - ✓ State Pays Contractor for Work Done
        - ✓ State Submits Voucher (Proof of Payment) to FHWA
          - - ✓ Treasury Reimburses State Federal Share (80%)








#### HIGHWAY TRUST FUND - REDUCED REIMBURSEMENTS








# 90th General Assembly First Extraordinary Session 2015

SB3 and HB1005--Allows certain farm vehicles and machinery on a short section of Highway 63.

- Passed out of Senate and House on May 28, 2015;
   now on the way to the Governor for Signature
- Paves the way for future designation of I-555



# 90th General Assembly First Extraordinary Session 2015

**SB4**, Corrected the Arkansas DWI statute to ensure compliance with federal safety requirements.


- Leeka v. State, 2015 Ark. 183, potentially made Arkansas non-compliant with Federal requirements, putting up to \$63 million in Federal funding at risk
- This bill corrected the law to bring it in compliance, and ensure continued federal funding


