




## The Teens

- First Commission Created
  - **√** No Highway Department
  - √ No Highway System
- \$72,000 Total Budget
- 36,000 Miles of Public Roads

#### 1951 - Highway Audit Commission Report

- 9 Legislative Acts Restructured Commission since 1913
- 1952 Mack Blackwell Amendment

## The Sixties and Seventies

- No changes to Commission Structure
- Department became Debt Free
- South Ter Legislature transferred nearly 4,400 more miles of County burning Roads to Highway System bonds at a ceremony in 1975.
  - Department adds "Transportation" to its name –
     Authority Expanded
  - 1st State to Complete its Interstate System (1975)
  - 16,000 Highway Miles (15,000 Paved)

# The Eighties and Nineties

- 1985 Rural Road Program out of the mud
- Early Retirements huge workforce turnover
- 1991 Highway Improvement Program
- 1993 Last Federal Gas Tax Increase first Scenic

  Byway of Arkansas.

1991 High 1999 We wast State Gast Tax Increase improve or replace approximately 560 bridges.

- 1999 Interstate Rehabilitation Program First Highway Bond Issue in 50 years
- I-540 (now I-49) and I-530 Completed
- 16,400 Highway Miles
  Hopper Tunnel, 1999

# Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act

- Authorizes 5 Years of Funding
  - Federal Fiscal Years (FFYs) 2016-2020
- \$225.2 Billion for Highway Investment
- \$250 Million Increase for Arkansas over
   5 Years
  - \$250 Million Increase from FFY 2015





## **Federal Funding**

- Second Continuing Resolution for FFY 2017
- Expires April 28th
- Funding at 2016 Levels
- Allows for Trump Administration to Weigh In on Budget Issues









# **Average Monthly Household Expenditures**







## 2015 Road User Related Tax Revenue






# 12th in Number of Miles





## 40th in Revenue Per Mile




#### **Fuel excise taxes**

Highway programs are funded in part with revenue from per-gallon excise taxes on gasoline and diesel. Arkansas and surrounding states also use general revenue on highways. This map shows the gasoline and diesel excise taxes per gallon in Arkansas and surrounding states.
