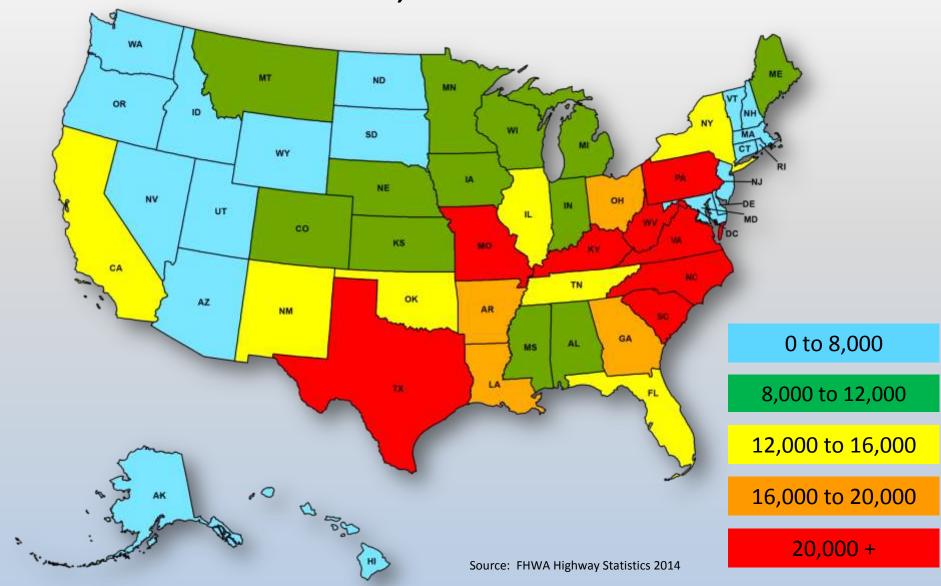

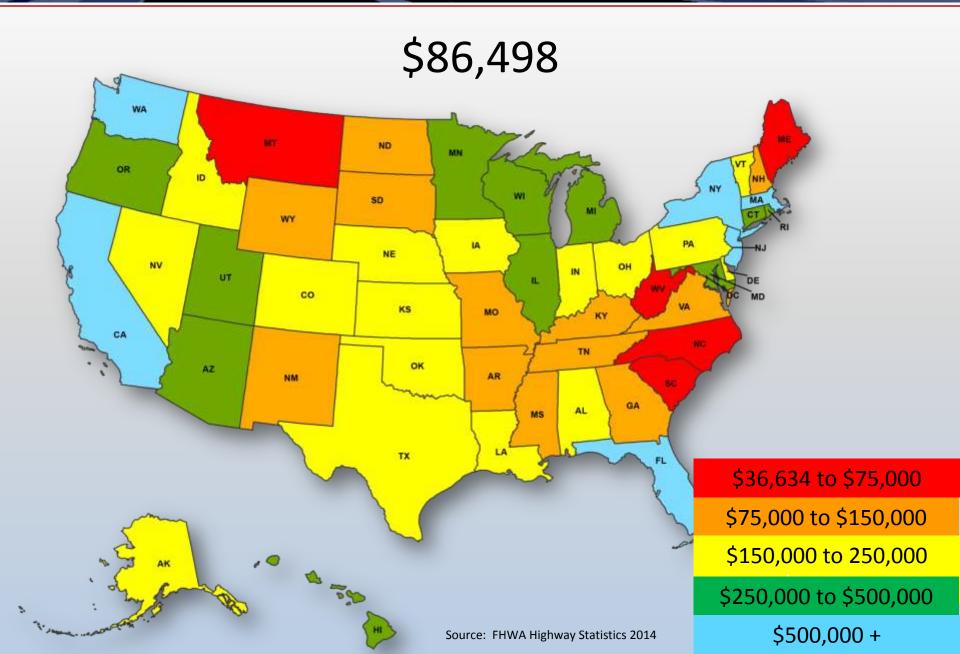

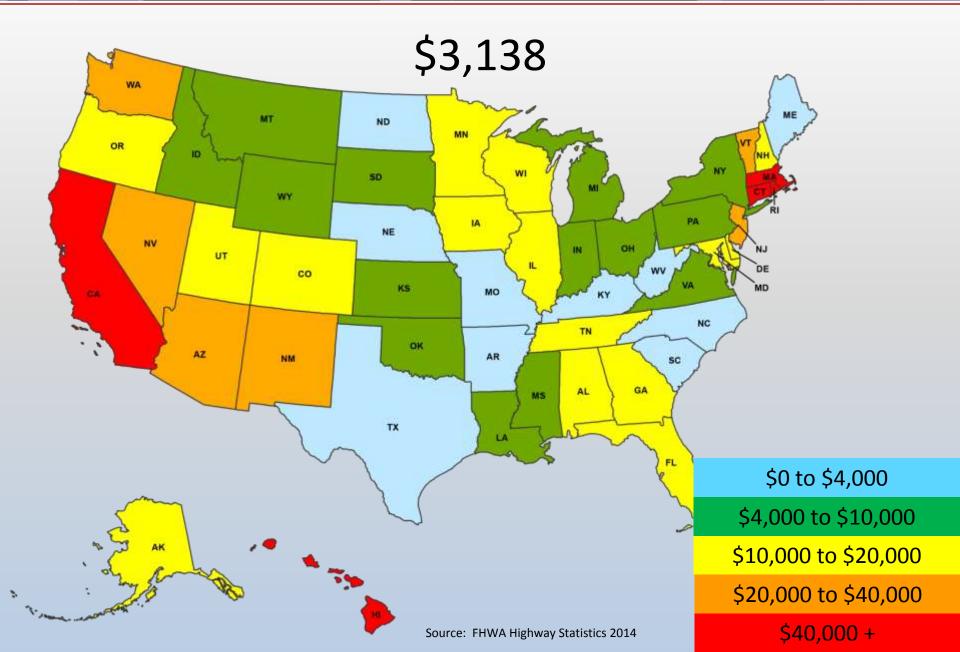


42nd in Revenue Per Mile



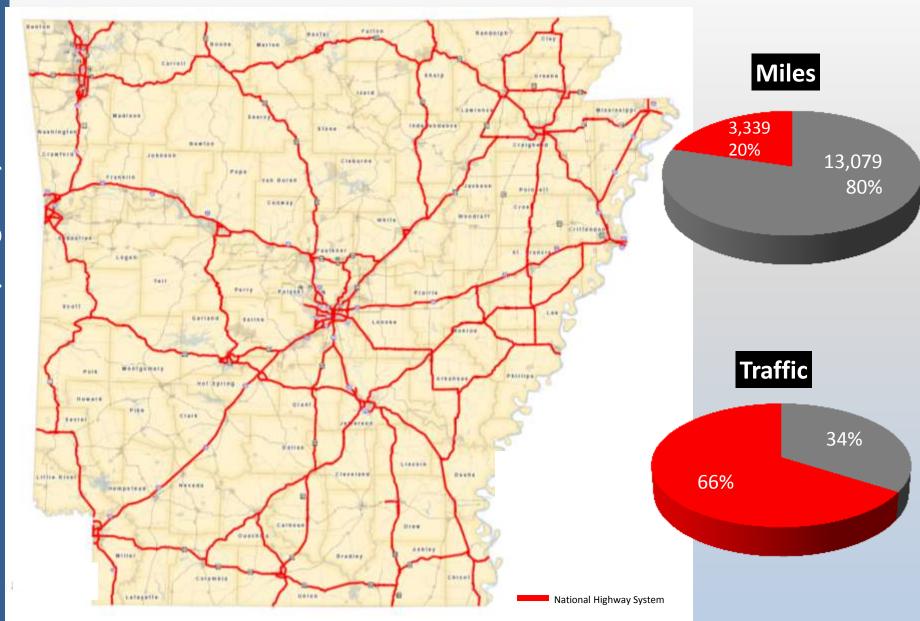


42nd Administrative Cost per Mile



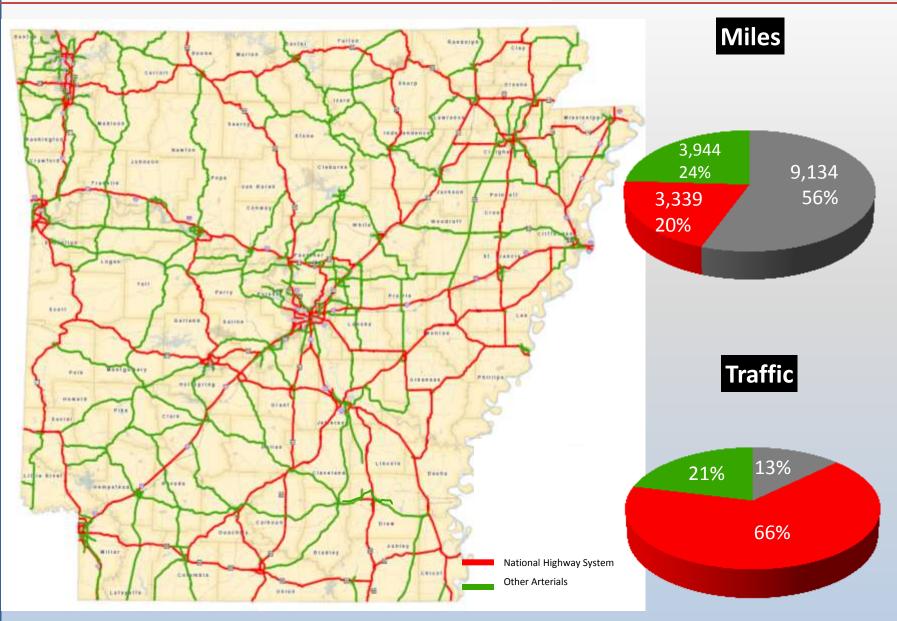


National Highway System



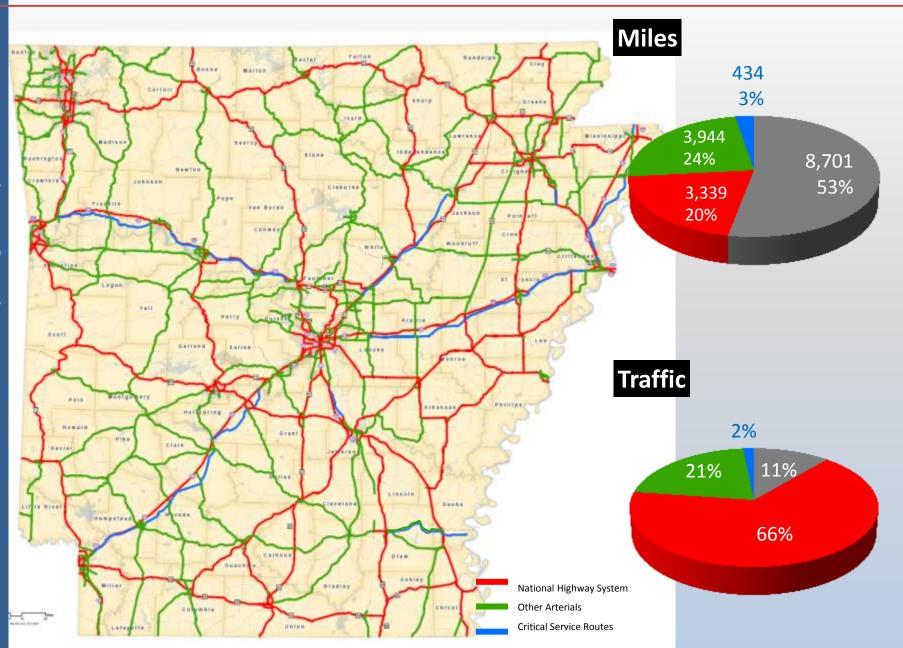

Critical Service Routes



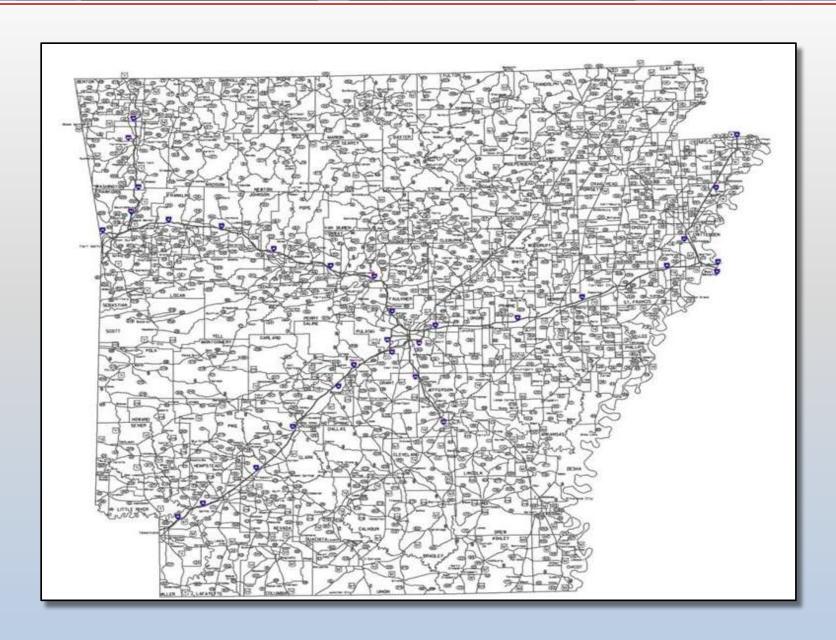
