








Arkansas Primary Highway Network — Non-Interstates






Arkansas Primary Highway Network






Non-Arkansas Primary Highway Network

- National Cooperative Highway Research Program (NCHRP)
 Synthesis 485
- Converting Paved Roads to Unpaved
 - ✓ Low or very low volume farm to market rural roads
 - ✓ Road deterioration accelerated due to the increasing sizes of agricultural and commercial equipment
 - ✓ Increased cost of materials and stagnant or declining maintenance budgets
 - ✓ Possible sustainable solution convert deteriorated paved roads to unpaved



Highway Revenue Distribution








