#### **Budget Overview**

- President Released the "New Foundation for American Greatness"
- Balanced Budget by 2027
- Reduction in Non-Defense Spending Each Year

  - Align Infrastructure Investment with Entities Best Suited to Provide Sustained and Efficient Investment
  - Leverage the Private Sector

#### **New Foundation for American Greatness**

- Federal Fiscal Year 2018
  - FAST Act Funding Levels for Highways are Honored
  - TIGER is Eliminated
  - Transit Funding Levels are Reduced
  - Amtrak Funding Levels are Reduced
- Federal Fiscal Year 2019 and 2020 Levels Capped
- Beyond Federal Fiscal Year 2020 40% Reduction

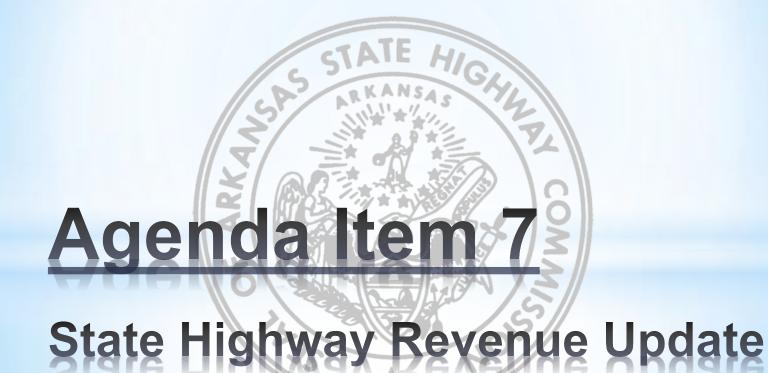

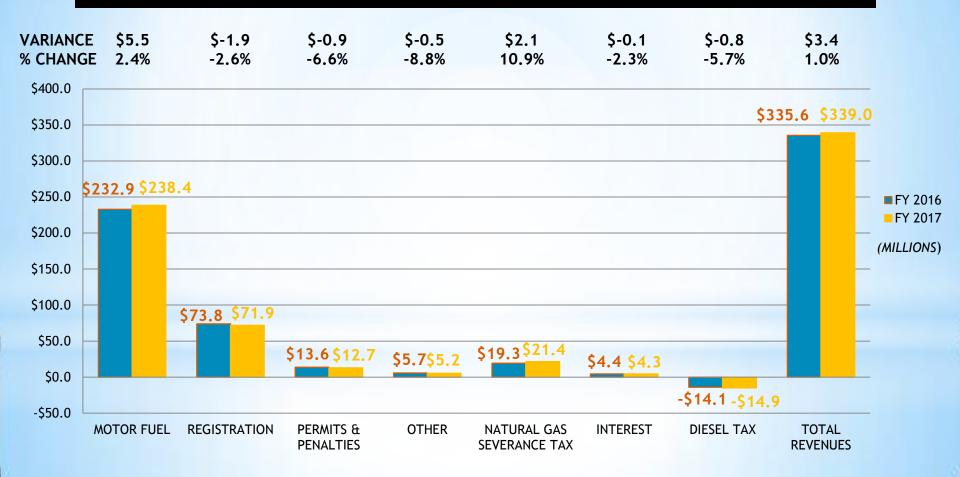

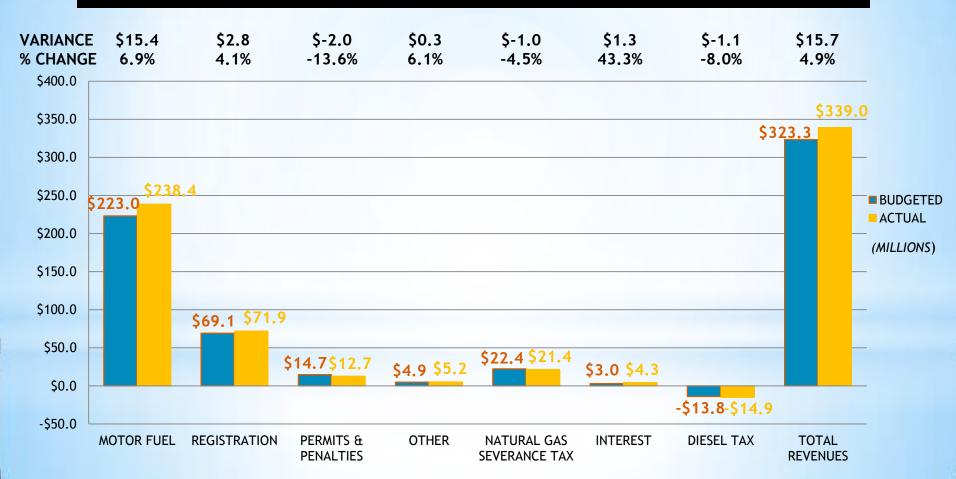

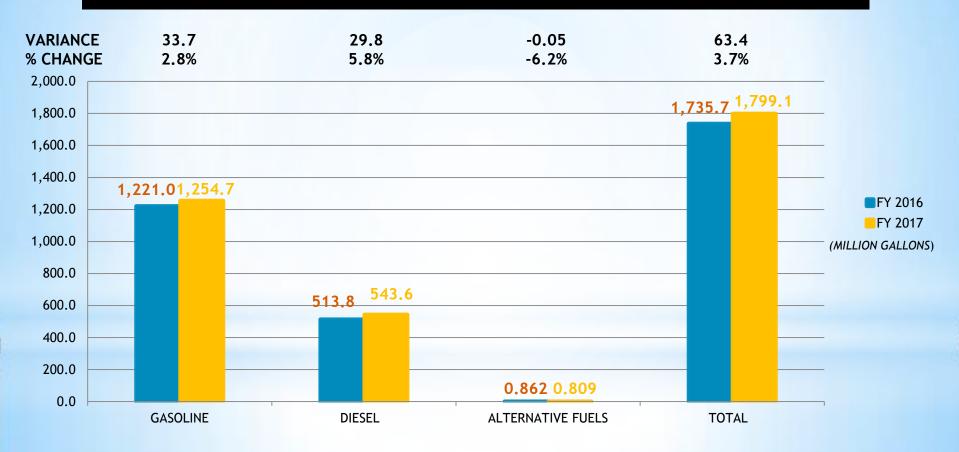
#### APRIL 2016-2017 REVENUE

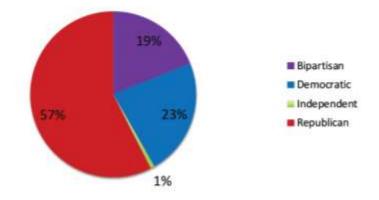




#### Types of State Transportation Funding Revenue Increases Introduced in 2017

## 2017 Legislative Session

- June 7, 2017 Decision on whether to pursue
- □ June October 2017 Discussion, stakeholder meetings, and possible polling
- October 18, 2017 Decision on funding proposal
- □ Early November 2017 Begin development of ballot language
- □ Early January 2018 Submit ballot language to Attorney General
- □ February June 2018 Publish ballot language in statewide newspaper
- □ February June 2018 Signature collection
- □ July 13, 2018 Deadline to file petitions with Secretary of State
- November 14, 2018 General election

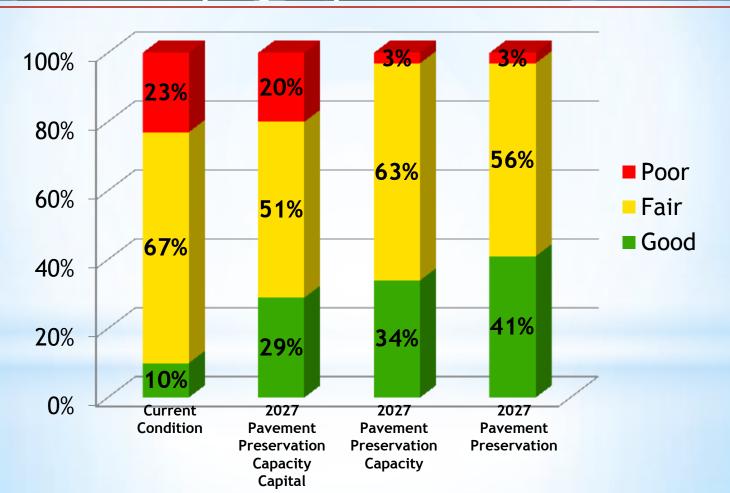
# Arkansas Highway Primary Network



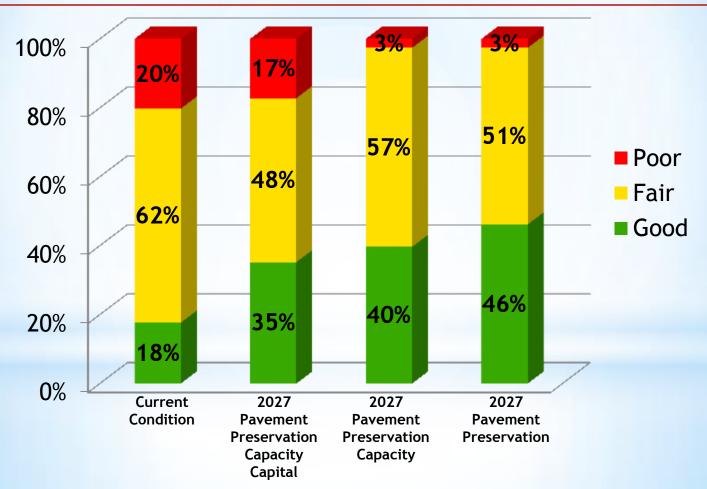

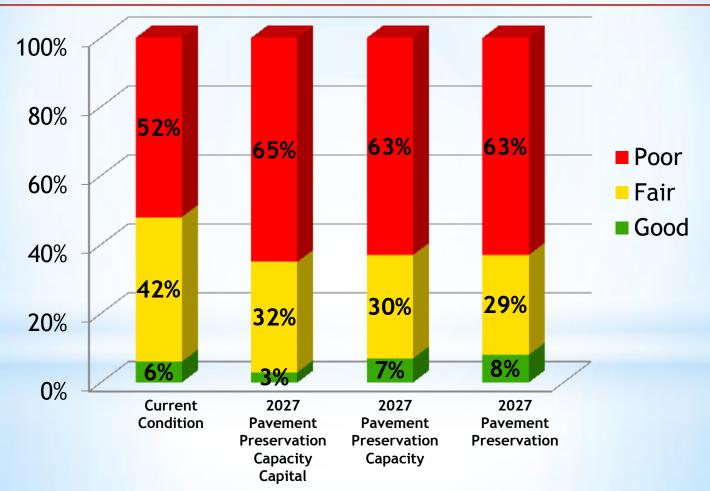
#### Arkansas Primary Highway Network — Non-Interstates



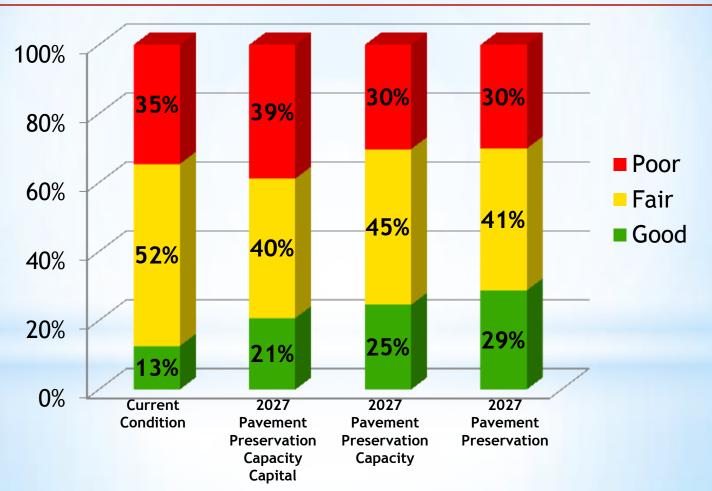
