

Surrounding States Average = \$4,334





- Federal Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020 Levels Capped
- Beyond Federal Fiscal Year 2020 40% Reduction






#### Federal vs. State Funding









As of 2015, using the same resources, only **15 miles** of Highway could be widened.








#### \$10,000,000 Overlay Program

#### **NOW**


As of 2015, using the same resources, only **54 miles** of Highway could be overlaid.







#### Political Parties of State Legislators Introducing Transportation Funding Legislation in 2017






#### Governor's Highway Funding Working Group

- ✓ Immediate: \$ 50 Million
- ✓ Short-term (0-3 years): \$110 Million
- ✓ Mid-term (3-5 years): \$250 Million
- ✓ Long-term (6-9 years):


#### Road User Related Tax Revenue (SFY 2016)




