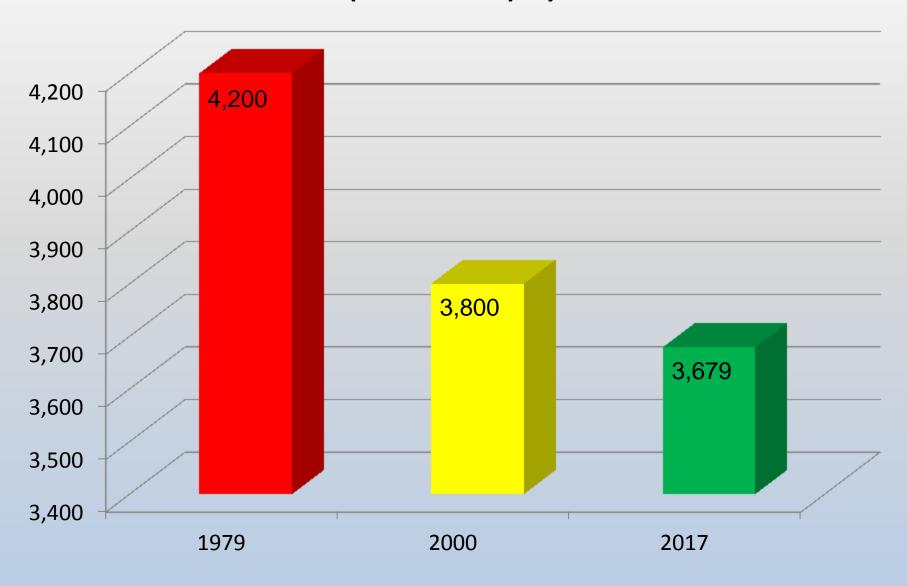

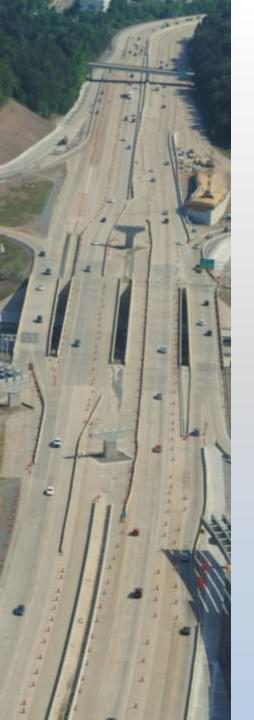

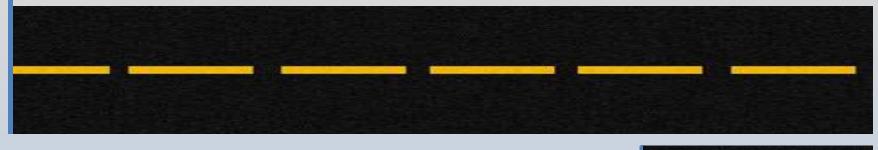

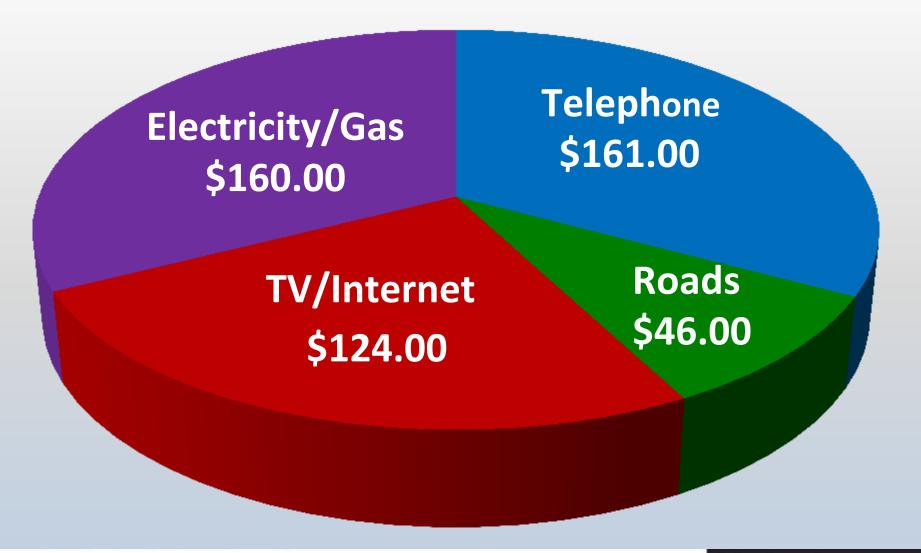

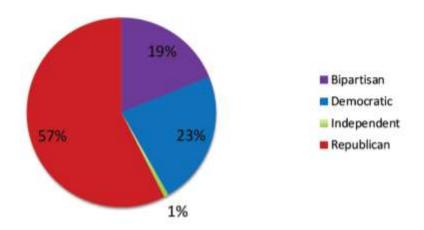

Political Parties of State Legislators Introducing Transportation Funding Legislation in 2017



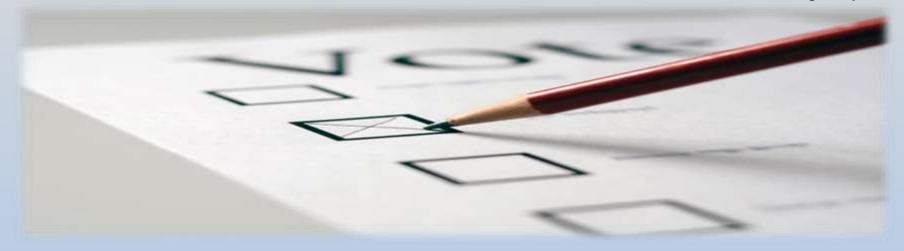

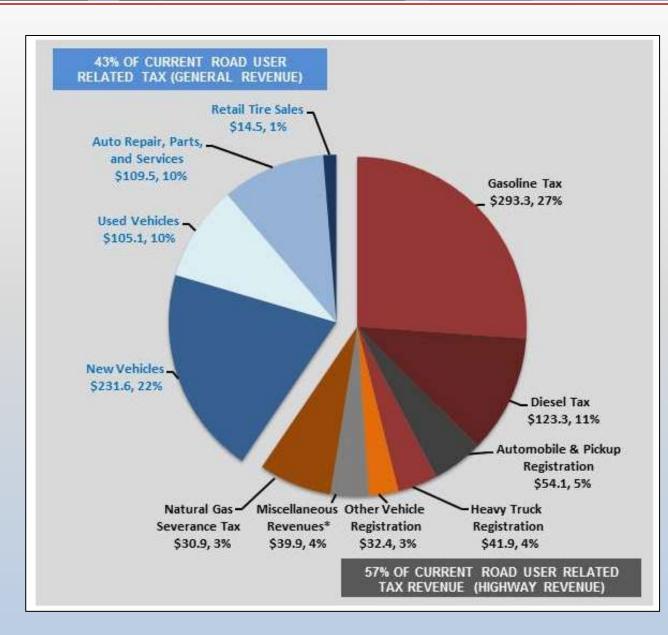
Road User Related Tax Revenue (SFY 2016)

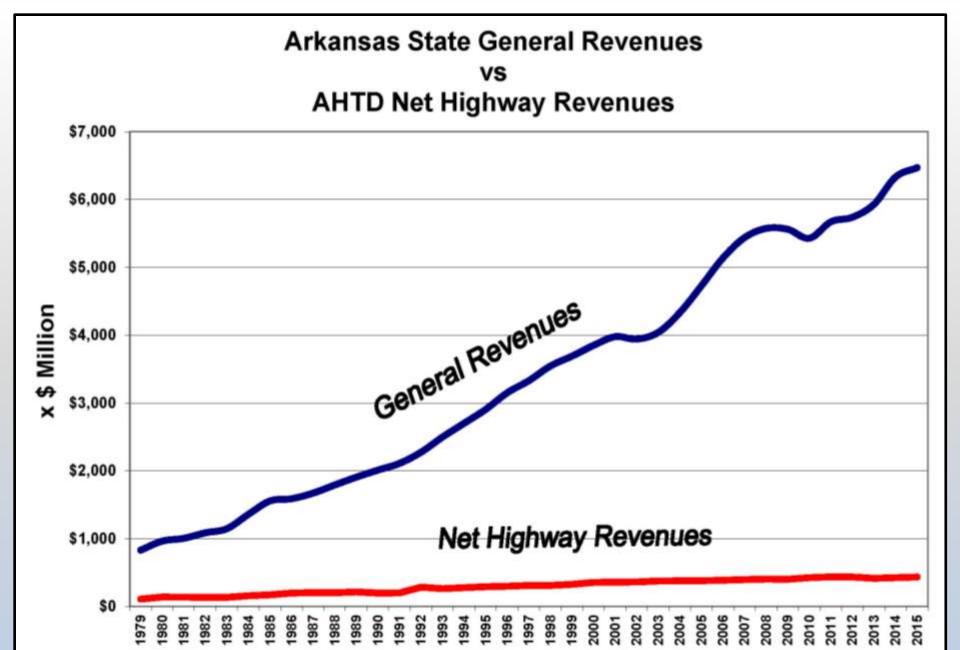

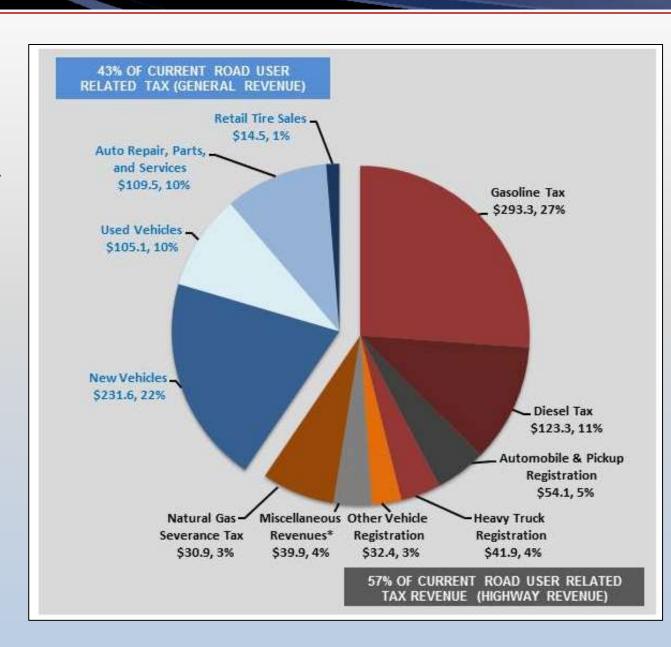
