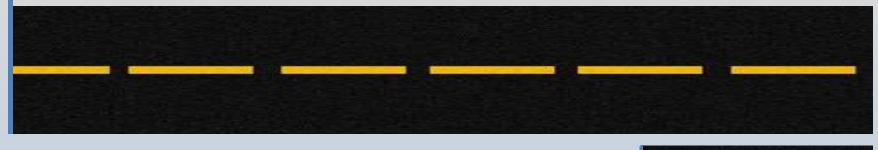

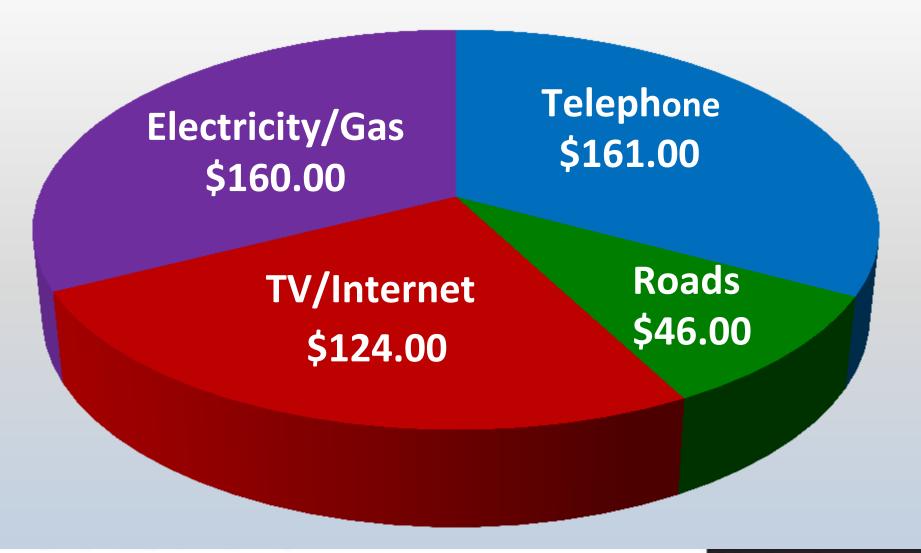




Governor's Highway Funding Working Group




Road User Related Tax Revenue (SFY 2016)
