



INTRODUCTION

This report is presented in response to a request for Arisansia Legislatine Audit (ALA) to review information, estimates, and calculations provided by the Arisansia Department of Transportation (AnDOT), formerly known as the Arisansia State Highway and Transportation Department, instated to highway funding. ARDOT has indicated that additional state funding is needed to fully maximize available federal funds and to expand non-federal construction and maintenance proceds.

OBJECTIVES

The objectives of this report were to:

- Provide information regarding state funding sources and uses for highways, with associated construction and maintenance costs, for prior years.
- Determine the amount of matching funds needed annually in order for ARDOT to receive the maximum federal aid available.
- Determine the amount of additional state revenues needed to fund ARDOT's proposed construction and maintenance program for roads and facilities.
- 4. Provide a history of bond issuances, including balances and associated costs.

SCOPE AND METHODOLOGY

This report was prepared by reviewing activities for state facol years ended June 30, 2010 through 2018, and projections and estimates for foderal facosi years ceding September 30, 2017 through 2009. Al.A shall reviewed audit reports from prior years, particularly reviewees and expenditures related to construction, and eleterated future to facility including from reports obtained from the Federal Highway Administration. All information for additional construction and maintenance projects was provided by AeDOT and tested for accuracy and reasonablements by ALA staff.

The methodology used in preparing this report was developed uniquely to address the stated objectives; therefore, this report is more limited in scope than an audit or attestation engagement performed in accordance with Golvenment Auditing Standards Issued by the Comptotice General of the United States.

BACKGROUND

AHOOT recognizes revenues from both federal and state sources. State revenues include motor fuel taxes, registration fees, returnal gas severance fees, and eventual permits and penalties. Many highway construction projects are funded with both federal and state menter. The percentage of state participation in these projects varies depending on the federal program involved, but most programs require a 20% motor.







Are you satisfied with the condition of the existing highway system?





Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC)

Background

Act 809 of 2017 established the CMGC Pilot Program:

5-year pilot program

Up to 3 projects can be delivered

Total combined value of projects not to exceed \$200 million

Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC)

What is CMGC?

CMGC is a qualifications based selection of a construction contractor to provide:

Constructability and innovation reviews during design

Opinions of Probable Construction Costs (OPCC) during design

Identification of risk and methods of risk mitigation during design

Bid to construct the project within the context of the contractor's preconstruction involvement

Independent Cost Estimator (ICE)

What is the ICE?

Independent Cost Estimator is used to validate the CMGC OPCCs:

The ICE is procured separate from the CMGC

Provides an independent cost estimate for each CMGC OPCC

Cost estimate is developed to simulate a "second bid"
