

ARDOT Working With State Agencies

- Involved in dozens of pickups and deliveries of medical supplies, PPE, and other pandemic items.
- Loaned forklifts to Arkansas Department of Emergency Management
- Employees working daily at the Joint Information Center at the Department of Health

ARDOT Employees

- Vehicles equipped with hand sanitizer & cleaning wipes, limited to a maximum of two passengers if it's a quad-cab, the windows are open, and the passengers wear masks.
- No overnight travel.
- No self-service at department fueling stations.
- Employees are to keep 6 feet distant when practical and masks are to be worn when that distance isn't able to be maintained.
- Working from home where possible and limiting work at the offices to essential tasks only.

ARDOT & Contractors

- Entered partnering agreements stating all parties will adhere to guidelines established by major health organizations while working on highway projects.
- Allowing contractors to request longer working hours on some projects due to reduced traffic volumes.
- Allowing time extensions on projects if contractor's crew is impacted by COVID-19.
- Implemented paperless ticketing for deliveries to jobsites.


