

# \$10,000,000 Overlay Program

### **THEN**

In 1998, **200 lane miles** of highway could be overlaid with \$10 million.

### **NOW**

In 2018, **90 lane miles** of highway could be overlaid with \$10 million.




# Average Monthly Household Expenditures



- Continues to Provide \$44 Million to Counties Annually

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




