Notice is hereby given that the Jonesboro Metropolitan Planning Organization is seeking letters of interest from qualified consulting firms to develop recommendations for improving safety in two areas of Jonesboro, consistent with maintaining the capacity of the transportation system. The two safety studies are as follows:

- Johnson Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Study
- Downtown Jonesboro Pedestrian Safety Study

The Johnson Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Study will include the area from Main Street to Caraway Road with particular focus given to the Arkansas State University (ASU) campus where pedestrian traffic is heavy.

The Downtown Jonesboro Pedestrian Safety Study will include the entire downtown area, and the study shall be consistent with maintaining the economic viability of the area.

Services will generally consist of consulting with staff; reviewing available plans and data; performing traffic studies as necessary; conducting one or more public involvement meetings; and preparing a report that summarizes findings, identifies alternatives and offers recommendations.

This project includes federal funds, and all work will be reviewed and approved by the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD). All work and contract requirements shall conform to the requirements of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and AHTD.

The firm shall specify which of the studies that they are interested in performing.
