Notice is hereby given that the Arkansas Department of Transportation (Department) is seeking letters of interest from qualified consulting firms to perform underwater inspection of various bridges. Services will be provided on an as-needed basis for a period of two years but may be extended up to an additional three years.

The work generally consists of underwater inspection of bridges located throughout the state as per the National Bridge Inspection Standards (NBIS). Water conditions will range from still water to moderate flows. At some locations, water depth will approach 110 feet. Still photos and underwater sonar imaging will be required where applicable.

The work must be supervised and all reports stamped and signed by a Registered Professional Engineer licensed to practice in Arkansas.
