ARKANSAS STATE HIGHWAY COMMISSION OPENS BIDS FOR IMPROVEMENTS IN CRITTENDEN COUNTY

LITTLE ROCK (4-13) -- The Arkansas State Highway Commission has opened bids for improvements to a roadway in Crittenden County, according to Commissioner John Ed Regenold of Armorel.

The purpose of the project is to add an auxiliary lane and relocate three ramps on Interstate 40 in West Memphis, in the vicinity of the new Arkansas Welcome Center currently under construction. The project will also relocate a connector road to Highway 191. APAC-Tennessee, Inc. of Memphis, Tennessee, was awarded the contract at \$5,849,734.98.

"This project will give motorists on Interstate 40 better access to the new Welcome Center in West Memphis when it is completed," stated Regenold.

The project is being funded with money provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA). The Act provided Arkansas with \$351 million in federal stimulus funds for roadway and bridge improvements throughout the state. Regenold said work could begin on the project in two to four weeks, weather permitting. Completion is expected in mid 2011.

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
