AHTD TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING IN GREEN FOREST

LITTLE ROCK (9-1) The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a Public Involvement Meeting in Green Forest to discuss plans for improvements to Highway 62, according to AHTD officials.

The proposed four-mile project includes alternatives to either improve existing Highway 62 through Green Forest, or, to relocate Highway 62 north or south of Green Forest.

The meeting will be held on Thursday, September 8th, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the Alumni Center of Green Forest School. The school is located at 610 S. Arch Avenue in Green Forest.
