AHTD TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING IN PORTIA

LITTLE ROCK (1-20) -- The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a Public Involvement Meeting in Portia to discuss plans for improvements to Highway 63, according to AHTD officials.

The proposed project will widen 1.5 miles of Highway 63 to five lanes, extending from Portia westward to Black Rock.

The meeting will be held on Thursday, February 2nd, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., at the Portia Community Center, 505 W. Front Street, in Portia.
