AHTD TO HOLD PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEETING IN MAMMOTH SPRING

LITTLE ROCK (7-3) - The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department (AHTD) will hold a Public Involvement Meeting in Mammoth Spring to discuss plans for improvements to Highway 63, according to AHTD officials.

The meeting will be held on Thursday, July 12th, from 4:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., in the Multi-Purpose Building of Mammoth Spring High School, 410 Goldsmith Avenue, in Mammoth Spring.

The proposed revised design plans call for widening Highway 63 to five lanes in the area of Mammoth Spring. The improvements would begin at Highway 9 in Mammoth Spring and continue southward to the vicinity of Highway 342.
