

AHTD Promotes Work Zone Awareness Week

The 2011 National Work Zone Awareness Week was held April 4th – 8th across the country. The theme for this year's campaign was "Safer driving. Safer work zones. For everyone."

The AHTD held a news conference on April 5th to promote safety in work zones in conjunction with the national campaign. The event was held at the Interstate 430/630 interchange in Little Rock.

"We put emphasis on safety throughout the year, but this week we really focus on it," stated Emanuel Banks, Assistant Chief Engineer for Operations.

"When you combine thousands of vehicles, construction workers, AHTD employees and suppliers at a busy work zone, the potential for conflicts is there."

In 2009, 667 people were killed in motor vehicle crashes in highway work zones across the country and more than 30,000 were injured.

D.B. Hill, III, of the Arkansas Chapter of Associated General Contractors also spoke at the event.

"There is always the need to make the public more aware of the dangers present in work zones," Hill commented. "Contractors, the Federal Highway Administration and the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department are striving to make work zones safer for motorists."

Hill added that in 2010, the number of fatalities on our national highways fell to the lowest level since 1949.

"There are numerous factors contributing to the decrease including safer vehicles, more four-lane highways, wider bridges, increased use of seatbelts and median safety cables," Hill stated.

"Safety is always a top priority in the transportation industry and we want to make sure motorists make it a top priority as they travel through work zones."

Bacon Cheddar Turtle Burger

Ingredients: Ground beef, sharp cheddar cheese, bacon, hot dogs.

Take refrigerated (not frozen) bacon strips and weave them together, with three or four strips going each direction. Set aside.

Form ground beef patty to make the middle of the "turtle." Slice three hotdogs in half to form the legs, tail and head. Nestle them in the patty, cover with cheddar, and wrap with bacon, leaving the ends of the hot dogs sticking out. Cut a mouth in the head, cut fingers in the feet and cut the tail to a point.

Place them on a rack, cover loosely with foil and then put them into an oven heated to 400 degrees. Bake for 20-30 minutes, or until the bacon is done.
