

Floodwaters Cover Highways in Arkansas

As if tornados weren't enough for Arkansans to deal with this spring, heavy rains in April and early May forced the closure of numerous highways across the state as floodwaters rose onto highways in the eastern delta and central Arkansas.

A total of 82 sections of highways, including Interstate 40 and Highway 67/167, were closed by AHTD offi-

cials due to water on the roadways during the month of May.

"We had to close highways in 17 counties as floodwaters began to rise," stated Emanuel Banks, Assistant Chief Engineer for Operations.

The closing that had the greatest impact on motorists was Interstate 40, between Hazen and Brinkley. It was closed in both directions as the White River rose out of its banks in Prairie County. It marked the first time ever the highway has been closed due to flooding. AHTD officials worked with Departments of Transportation in Tennessee, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi to warn motorists coming into Arkansas of upcoming detours routing traffic out of the flooded areas.

"Interstate 40 in that area handles approximately 30,000 vehicles a day. At least 50% of those are trucks." added Banks. "The situation had a huge impact that affected traffic for several days."

Another major highway that was overrun by water was Highway 67/167, just south of Jacksonville. The detour meant longer commutes for motorists coming in and out of Little Rock from Jacksonville and cities to the north.

The closed highways around the state resulted in a high volume of telephone inquiries to the Department. Staff at

Central Office responded to the conditions by setting up a telephone bank to handle the onslaught of calls from motorists.

Volunteers from each division in the Central Office were recruited to answer phone calls throughout Mother's Day weekend and the early days of the following week.

"We had a dozen telephones

in our temporary phone bank and operators were kept busy for days," stated Ralph Hall, Assistant to the Director.

Over six days, the phone bank received just under 15,000 inquiries regarding flooded highways.

In the Public Affairs Office, a series of news conferences was coordinated to keep the media informed of flooding conditions on Interstate 40 and resulting detours. In addition, up-to-the-minute road conditions were available to the public on the Department's webpage at www.arkansashighways.com.

Though Interstate 40 and Highway 67/167 opened again in the week that followed, a long list of flooded highways and a high volume of telephone calls kept AHTD staff busy for several weeks after the storms passed through.

8 ounces of Cool Whip 2 packages of Kool-Aid (any flavor) 1 can Eagle Brand milk 1 graham cracker pie crust


