

Program Update: Litter Reporting Hotline

In December of 2004, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department kicked off a new Litter Violator Reporting System and 24-hour Litter Hotline asking motorists' assistance in fighting a constant litter problem on Arkansas' highways. Today, seven years after it was announced, the program is still going strong.

"Our Department spends \$4.7 million a year on litter removal," stated AHTD Director Scott Bennett. "The Litter Hotline program has had a positive effect on keeping proper disposal of trash on the minds of motorists traveling our highways."

Now in its eighth year, Department officials have kept statistics each year on the volume of calls to the hotline and the type of litter being reported. For 2011, almost 5,000

Arkansas State University Offers Online Degree Programs to AHTD Employees

The AHTD is pleased to announce an opportunity for all Department personnel to complete a bachelor's degree or obtain a master's degree online through an Academic Outreach Initiative.

Arkansas State University is offering two distinct, high quality, affordable degree programs.

The first one is a Bachelor of Science degree in Interdisciplinary Studies. This program is designed for those with previously earned college credit. Students self-design a curriculum taking courses in three areas of emphasis which are representative of some of ASU's majors and minors. The program has six start dates each year and each online course is completed in seven weeks. The cost of the program is \$578 per course. The second program is a Master of Public Administration degree. This nationally accredited MPA program is designed to enhance the careers of public sector professionals in order to achieve management, director or executive-level positions within their chosen fields. This MPA program degree offers courses that focus on the skills required for effective public management. It also has six start dates per year. Each online course is completed in seven weeks. Cost of this program is \$722 per course.

These programs are also available to family members of Department personnel.

Momma's Cranberry Salad



- 1 quart Cranberries
- 1 package of Jell-O (cherry or strawberry)
- 2 cups of sugar
- 1 small can of crushed pineapple
- 1 tablespoon of plain gelatin
- 1 1/2 cups of miniature marshmallows (more or less to taste)
- 1 cup of nuts, chopped (walnuts, pecans, almonds)

Run cranberries through food chopper/processor and cover with sugar. Let stand overnight. The next morning, dissolve Jell-O in 1 cup of hot water. Dissolve plain gelatin in cool water and add to hot Jell-O. When it begins to congeal, add cranberries, pineapple, nuts and marshmallows. Keep in refrigerator or freezer.

4-Day Work Week...

Effective March 8th through October 31, 2012, the following personnel will work a four-day, ten-hour schedule Monday through Thursday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. with a half hour lunch:

Field Maintenance Personnel; District Shop
Crews; Storeroom Personnel; Area Maintenance
Supervisors; Job Superintendents; Shop
Supervisors; Equipment Maintenance Supervisors;
Signing, Striping and Profiling Crews; Traffic
Engineering Personnel; Sign Shop Personnel;
Surveys Division Survey Parties; Heavy Bridge
Maintenance Crews; Facilities Management
Personnel; Radio Maintenance Specialists; Safety
Inspection Officers; Equipment and Procurement
Shop Personnel; and Technical Services Section
Field Personnel.

On those weeks containing a holiday, the schedule will revert to a five-day, eight-hour work week. Vacation or sick leave for a ten-hour day will be charged as ten hours. Half days will be charged as five hours.

Districts will rotate service station personnel so that one person will be on a five-day, eight-hour work week in order to keep the station open from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Friday.

The Equipment Preventive Maintenance Program is to be carried out fully during the four-day work week period.

calls were received by the Arkansas Highway Police. The program has received that many calls or more each year that it has been in existence.

"Based on the volume of calls we receive each year, it is obvious that this program has been well received by the public and has motivated motorists to do something about litter on the highways," Bennett added.

In addition to the number of calls received, data is kept on the type of litter being discarded. Among the items reported to the hotline are typical items such as plastic shopping bags, aluminum cans, food wrappers, paper and cigarette butts. Among the more unusual items appearing on the list of things thrown or falling from vehicles were a bookshelf that fell off the back of a vehicle, flip flops, plywood, a living room chair, a laundry basket and cd/dvd cases.

"All of these items have to be picked up by our Department


crews or by volunteers in the Adopt-A-Highway program," Bennett added.

Motorists who spot a littering violation along any streets, roads or highways are encouraged to call the hotline at 1-866-811-1222 to report the situation. Phone calls are answered 24 hours a day by an office of the Arkansas Highway Police who then record the incident. A letter regarding the violation is then sent to the registered owner of the vehicle.

"Recurring violations reported from the same vehicle may eventually result in an in-person visit by an Arkansas Highway Police Officer to investigate the problem," states Arkansas Highway Police Chief Ron Burks. "We want motorists to know that Arkansas' litter laws are actively enforced."
